

Minister's Greetings

This month we celebrate O-higan. Higan is an abbreviation of "To-Higan" which literally meaning "to reach the other shore." In Buddhism, the world of suffering is referred to as "this shore" and the world of Enlightenment is called "other shore." In order to reach the other shore, we do not have to wait for our lives to end. We can all reach the other shore right now by hearing and entrusting in the Buddha's vows and allowing Buddha's energy to fill our hearts and minds with wisdom and compassion.

During our meditation session each Sunday morning here at the Temple we often recite the six paramitas (perfections). We recite them in this way:

- 1. Dana (generosity) May I be generous and helpful!
- 2. Sila (Discipline) May I be pure and virtuous!
- 3. Ksanti (Patience) May I be patient; May I be able to bear and forbear the wrongs of others!
- 4. Virya (Exertion) May I be strenuous, energetic, and persevering!
- 5. Dhyana (Meditation) May I practice meditation and attain concentration and oneness to serve all beings!
- 6. Prajna (Wisdom) May I gain wisdom and be able to give the benefit of my wisdom to others!

"We should focus our attention on greater striving to follow these Six Paramita so that we may cross from this shore; this Saha world of delusion to the land of Eternal Enlightenment not just for ourselves but for others."

These Six Paramita teach us the essential Buddhistic way of life which every Buddhist should follow every day. Applying the Six Paramita in our daily lives is the Shinshu way of expressing our gratitude and thanksgiving for our unconditional salvation.

They are said to be like the stone on which we sharpen the blade of our lives so that we may better cut through the illusions of suffering and lead countless others to the Pure Land of Happiness.

The observance of Ohigan gives us an opportunity to gather and express our gratitude to the Buddha for teaching us the way.
