

It has now been over seven months since we held our last in-person Sunday service.

November is a month of planning for the Temple. Our second General Membership Meeting of the year is an important meeting for the administration of the Temple. The Temple needs to implement plans for the upcoming new year by passing a budget and nominating members to replace outgoing Board members. Usually, this essential business is conducted at the Temple. Unfortunately, with the coronavirus

still going strong and an upcoming flu season on the horizon, the Board has decided that holding an inperson meeting at the Temple would not be safe. Therefore, we will have our first Virtual General Membership Meeting on Sunday, November 8, 2020 at 2 pm.

Virtual meetings are held on the internet using cell phones, laptop computers, and tablets. Virtual meetings are difficult but certainly not impossible. BCA regularly conducts virtual seminars with several hundred participants. Our Board has held virtual meetings since March and Rev. Warrick routinely holds virtual Sunday services and virtual weekly meditation sessions.

For the General Membership Meeting, we plan to use the ZOOM technology. With a ZOOM meeting, the Temple will send an e-mail to each pledge member that contains a link to the site of the meeting about a week before the scheduled meeting. The e-mail will also contain a copy of the Agenda and of the proposed 2021 Budget. At the scheduled meeting time, the participant goes to his/her computer opens the e-mail and clicks on the link, uploads the software and connects to the meeting. A participant can also use a telephone to call into the meeting and participate verbally.

If you do not receive a copy of an e-mail message containing a ZOOM link by November 2, 2020 check your other e-mail accounts since we may have used one of them. If you still can't find the e-mail message please contact office@wrbt.org.
