

Minister's Greetings

Well, here we are in November again. During November we usually think of the Thanksgiving holiday. This year we are still in the grips of the COVID-19 crisis. Hopefully we can join with our loved ones and celebrate this wonderful holiday together. Although Thanksgiving is not usually considered a Buddhist holiday, it is a time when we can pause and be grateful for all the blessings that come to us no matter what form. We should feel fundamentally grateful for everything that happens to us. Even this continuing pandemic if it brings us together in love, understanding and

gratitude.

Although Halloween has already passed, with all that scary stuff that goes with it; I want to present you with something scary that I ran across the other day. It is an article on the BCA website by the Wheel of Dharma editor, Jon Kawamoto. I will not present the entire article because the title "BCA Facing 'Severe' Shortage of Ministers" is scary enough. The shortage is linked to a number of divergent factors, which are combining to create a perfect storm of a dilemma: a wave of ministerial retirements over the past year and this year, leaves of absence, and the unexpected, unforeseen impacts of the pandemic. Currently, there are 35 Kaikyoshi ministers actively covering the BCA's 58 temples and churches. The BCA's active 130 Ministers Assistants (MAs) are playing a vital role in making up for the shortfall by providing Dharma messages and services for a number of churches and temples.

It is on the role of the Ministers Assistants that I will focus. The origins of the Minister's Assistant Program dates to the time of BCA Bishop Hakubun Watanabe and was further developed during the time that Reverend Koshin Ogui was Bishop. The BCA Minister's Assistant Program was established to fulfill exactly what the name implies: to assist ministers. It was started over 20 years ago as an experimental program. No longer experimental it is approved by the BCA Ministers' Association.

The levels of BCA Minister's Assistants are:

Minister's Assistant with Kyoshi: Title "Reverend"

Minister's Assistant with Tokudo: Title "Reverend"

Certified Minister's Assistant: No title
Minister's Assistant: No title

This program is only open to BCA members who are specifically recommended by their resident or supervising Kaikyoshi minister. They must also have the approval by their local temple board. This is the only English language program that meets the ordination requirements as set forth by the Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha.

I have personally been involved in this program since it's inception. Becoming a MA can be a life changing event. Anyone who has the desire to learn, teach and help spread the Buddha Dharma, please contact me for further information.

Hello, temple members.

November is a month of planning for the Temple. Our second General Membership Meeting of the year is scheduled for Sunday, November 14, 2021 at 11 am. It is an important meeting for the administration of the Temple. The Temple must implement plans for the upcoming new year by passing a budget and nominating members to replace outgoing Board members. Usually, this essential business is conducted at the Temple. Although Covid 19 vaccination rates continue to rise and new cases seem to

be slowing, the Board has nevertheless decided to be on the safe side and hold one more virtual General Membership meeting.

Similar to our last two General Membership Meetings, we plan to use the ZOOM technology. With a ZOOM meeting, the Temple will send an e-mail to each pledge member that contains a link to the site of the meeting a few days before it is scheduled. The e-mail will also contain a copy of the Agenda and of the proposed 2022 Budget. At the scheduled meeting time, the participant goes to his/her computer opens the e-mail and clicks on the link, uploads the software and connects to the meeting. A participant can also use a telephone to call into the meeting and participate verbally.


Security False Alarms: ADT sent a repairman out in late September to replace the back hallway sensor. We haven't had any false alarms since.
