Minister's Greetings

Greetings,

Well, here we are again in April. This will be the next to the last newsletter that I will be writing. I do not know who the next person will be to share the Dharma with you in this way. Just as I do not know who will conduct services at WRBT in the near future.

Due to the shortage of Kaikyoshi ministers in BCA right now the need for ordained priests has never been greater. Because of this the BCA Minister's Assistant Program was established to fulfill exactly what the name implies: to assist ministers.

The Ministerial Assistant (MA) is a voluntary position/status for those wishing to learn the Jodo Shinshu tradition and to provide ministerial support to their local temple.

The BCA's active 130 Ministers Assistants (MAs) are playing a vital role in making up for the shortfall by providing Dharma messages and services for several churches and temples.

The origins of the Minister's Assistant Program dates to the time of BCA Bishop Hakubun Watanabe and was further developed during the time that Reverend Koshin Ogui was Bishop. The program was started over 20 years ago as an experimental program. No longer experimental it is approved by the BCA Ministers' Association.

This program is only open to BCA members who are specifically recommended by their resident or supervising Kaikyoshi minister. They must also have the approval by their local temple board. This is the only English language program that meets the ordination requirements as set forth by the Jodo Shinshu Hongwanji-ha. I urge any WRBT member to consider how you might get involved with this program.

Becoming a MA can be a life changing event. Anyone who has the desire to learn, teach and help spread the Buddha Dharma, please contact me for further information.

There is an old saying "April showers bring May flowers", but this year, it seems we had plenty of showers in March. Because there are plenty of April flowers blooming right now.

This month we celebrate Hanamatsuri "Japanese flower festival" along with the celebration of the Buddha's birth. The original purpose of the Hanamatsuri festival was to encourage flowers such as the cherry blossom to stay in bloom. The idea being that the longer the blossoms stayed in bloom the more prosperous the harvest would be. This in itself being a message of hope.

In celebrating Shakyamuni Buddha's birthday, we pay tribute to the man who according to our Jodo Shinshu tradition, "appeared in this world solely to teach the ocean-like Primal Vow of Amida Buddha".



Social distancing will be observed with limited capacity for services and events;


Vaccination verification (for those who are currently eligible) will be conducted as you enter the temple;
