

In the face of systemic racism and state-sanctioned violence, how can we use our anger into a force for liberation? *In Love and Rage*, Lama Rod Owens shows how anger from historic white supremacism needs to be acknowledged, explored and respected, to heal from heartbreak and walk the path of liberation. This book offers a vision of how anger, can be used as a vehicle for radical social change and enduring spiritual transformation. Love and Rage weaves the inimitable wisdom and lived experience of Lama Rod Owens with Buddhist philosophy, practical meditation exercises, mindfulness, tantra, pranayama, ancestor practices, energy work, and classical yoga. The result is a book that serves as both a balm and a blueprint for those seeking justice who can feel overwhelmed with anger--and yet who refuse to relent. It is a necessary text for these times.

Facilities Committee

<u>Kitchen Freezer Breakdown</u>: The kitchen freezer quit working in April. Key Mechanical sent a technician out to fix it. Although it is now running, it is very noisy and continues to leak oil. It would be very expensive to repair the 20-year-old freezer. The Board is evaluating its options.

Ruts in grass: JR is waiting until the ground dries before fixing the ruts. JR and Charles are continuing to mow the temple lawns. Mary, Craig, and Randy continue to work on the garden areas.

Salal Pruning on north side: The owners of the cut-flower company have pruned and trimmed a one-foot border along the temple's north wall. They had offered to do the pruning in exchange for being allowed to keep the salal cuttings.

Updating our Temple Insurance Policy to specifically include scrolls and statues and other religious objects around the Onaijin and Hondo: The list of separately identified religious artifacts and artwork has been submitted to Liberty Mutual for a cost estimate.

<u>Auburn Way Bus stop Improvement:</u> This project is moving along.

<u>Parking lot Potholes</u>: JR is ordering a load of gravel to fill in the potholes.
