# **Minister's Greetings**

May 2023 is a very special month for Jodo Shinshu Buddhists! Every year on May 21, we celebrate Shinran Shonin's, the founder of Jodo Shinshu's, birthday which is called Gotan-e. This year, it is very special as we are celebrating his 850<sup>th</sup> birthday!!! It is important to celebrate such an occasion because if Shinran Shonin was not born, there would have never have been a sect of Buddhism called Jodo Shinshu nor would we have such a great Sangha or community like White River!

To honor this historic event, the mother temple in Kyoto, Japan is celebrating Shinran Shonin's 850<sup>th</sup> birth-day in 2023 and into 2024 (along with the 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of Jodo Shinshu). If you would like to watch these celebrations, the mother temple in Kyoto has livestreams on YouTube every so often (though it is in Japanese). This month, many temples and Sangha members of the Buddhist Churches of America are making a pilgrimage to Kyoto to celebrate these historic events.

If one were to attend the celebrations, not only will you see Gomonshu-sama (the Head of Jodo Shinshu), you will be chanting the Shoshin Nembutsu Ge (The Hymn on True Nembutsu and Shinjin), a hymn written by Shinran Shonin. You will also witness Gyodo or the circumambulation around the statue of Amida Buddha. This ritual is only used during special celebrations making it a very special ritual to witness.

Though we will not be doing a big celebration like this for White River's Gotan-e, we will be having a joint celebration of Shinran Shonin's 850<sup>th</sup> birthday and the 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of Jodo Shinshu at the Northwest District Convention this September. So please join us on Sunday, May 21<sup>st</sup> as well as in September for our celebration of these historic events.

How rare it is to encounter such an event! And how rare it is to encounter the Jodo Shinshu teachings!!
