Happy Obon Season!!

July into August in the Northwest is recognized as Obon season. This is where we are able to go to different temple's Obons and have a great time with not only our friends and families, but also with those that we have lost in the past.

I am pretty sure that everyone has heard the origin story of Obon. This story is about Mogallana, one of Shakyamuni Buddha's disciples, and his mother, who had recently passed. As an arhat, Mogallana had the ability to look into the various realms we can reincarnate to. He was devastated upon finding his mother reincarnated into the realm of the hungry ghosts where she is unable to eat [the realm of the hungry ghosts is a lower realm in which beings are unable to eat because the food turns

to ash before they reach their mouths or that their throats are too skinny to allow anything to go through].

In anguish, Mogallana asked Shakyamuni Buddha what he could do to help his mother. The Buddha answered Mogallana's inquiry and told him to host a service in honor of his mother with offerings of food. Immediately, the arhat conducted the service with the drive to help his mother escape this lower realm.

After the service concludes, Mogallana immediately looks into the realm of hungry ghosts to find his mother again and see if anything changed. He finds his mother able to eat and in joy of this discovery, celebrates by dancing in happiness. This is the origin of Obon and Obon Odori or Obon dancing.

Obon is a time for us to not only make memories and have a fun time with friends and family, but also be able to think upon all of those who have passed.

So this Obon season, please have a fun time while also remembering those who have passed on before us.
