For us Buddhists, dragons are a mythical being that we believe are able to fly freely between the heavenly and human realms of existence. The most popular places they are said to be witnessed are high up in the mountains where you can see them flying above the clouds (a reason why tall mountains are often sacred places for Buddhists). It is also said that there were dragons dancing in the sky when Prince Siddhartha Gautama was born.

We as Jodo Shinshu Buddhists also adore dragons. The college affiliated with our school of Buddhism is called Ryukoku University; "Ryu" means dragon and "koku" means valley (since Kyoto is in a valley). And you might not have known that the mother temple in Kyoto has the same name, Ryukokuzan (with "zan" meaning mountain). The Gomonshu's (head of our sect of Buddhism) commemorative monto shikisho and wagesa (the Buddhist sash lay members and ministers wear respectively) for his ascension is purple with white dragons.

Dragons are amazing creatures and some of us may still believe they exist. Still it is interesting to know that the fascination of dragons are alive today in Buddhism!




Ministers Assistant Program Training
